ABOUT CO-MEMO-S

The Co-Memo-S project aims to design a comprehensive training program for youth workers that empowers them to connect younger and older generations around the theme of sustainability by exploring and sharing local socio-ecological memories and knowledge.

This training program includes a Handbook (state of the arts, ideas, stories, and tools that the youth workers can use in their own way), educational videos (about air pollution, water pollution, climate change, ecosystem exploitation and greenhouse gases emission), an E-learning platform and a Virtual Archive (with socio-ecological memories).

The developed materials are translated into the partners languages and tested by end-users in the partner countries. The testing period was between December 2025 and mid-February 2026 with the aim of gathering feedback from 100 Youth Workers and Representatives of Youth Organisations. The main evaluation aspects were: content relevance and alignment, language and accessibility, structure and readability, visual presentation and design, cultural representation and inclusivity, and practical usefulness.

All of the developed materials are very positively evaluated.
